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SVCC is a Vital Economic Resource

Fall of 2021 saw the results from a statewide Economic Impact Study on community colleges. The study, last issued in 2014, assessed the value of Illinois' community college system, bringing to light good news for the Sauk Valley region.

According to the report issued by the Illinois Community College Board, Illinois' 48 community colleges boost local Illinois economies and are important sources of revenue and employment for the communities and regions they serve.

"This study confirms that Sauk Valley Community College is a vital economic resource for the Sauk Valley region with an economic output of \$15.9 million in the last fiscal year," commented Dr. David Hellmich, SVCC President. "Investing in SVCC and Illinois' other public community colleges helps ensure the state has a well-trained workforce, pumping billions of dollars back into local communities."







Updates Around Campus

SVCC's campus saw updates and improvements in 2021-2022 for both students and community members.

The fall semester kicked off with the unveiling of an electronic message center to mark the college's location along Route 2. The original Sauk Valley Community College sign was retired and replaced with a marquee designed to be updated with information to keep the community up-to-date.

Spring came along, and so did updates geared toward improving student experiences. The second floor, west end, underwent construction to update classrooms and add a student lounge space. The student area has been well received, allowing for individuals to gather between classes to study, collaborate, and form connections.

A study space in the Learning Commons Library received upgrades in March 2022. Study pods in the library replaced tables to provide a quiet and private space for students to focus comfortably on their studies.







A Lasting Impact

In 2018, SVCC, the Sauk Valley College Foundation Board of Directors, and external community leaders began work to develop and customize an earned-tuition program that would open doors of access to higher education for thousands of prospective students. Based on national promise program models, but unique to the Sauk Valley, the college and foundation designed the Impact Program with specific regional needs in mind.

- September 1, 2021 marked the end of the sign up for the pilot program in Fulton and Prophetstown. 80 students registered for the pilot program and 67% of students completed their 25 hours and progressed within the program.
- The Impact Team hired two additional Impact Coordinators before launching the district-wide sign up period in April 2022.
- Within the first month of launching the sign-up period, 220 students opted into the program.
- The SVCC Impact Program has more than 750 students enrolled.

Growing the 815

Fiscal year 2022 was another productive year for the Illinois Small Business Development Center (SBDC) at SVCC, advising over 198 new clients in the Sauk Valley area with 987 total advising hours. The team at the SBDC also helped start 20 new businesses, created 34 new jobs, retained 28 existing jobs, and generated \$1.84 million dollars in economic impact in the Sauk Valley region. For every local dollar invested into the SBDC program, over \$43.75 was generated in economic activity that spurs positive growth of the Sauk Valley regional economy.

The staff at the Illinois Small Business Development Center continue to operate in a hybrid mode with most advising taking place virtually, as it allows more flexibility for clients. Whether you need assistance applying for a business loan or are interested in starting a new business, growing an existing one, or even reviewing an existing plan to help streamline expenses or find new revenue streams, the SBDC team is ready to assist you!
