**Nursing – Pre-licensure (Effective 2023-2024 catalog)**

Students transferring to ISU for nursing are required to complete a minimum of 55 credit hours (of which 37 hours must be IAI) prior to the fall term of planned admission (fall admission only). Must have an earned A.A. degree or IAI completed.

Transfer students attending ISU for nursing are required to complete the following courses or equivalents with a grade of C or better by their start date.
